



Module 7: Video 1 Transcript, Multisensory Learning Sensory Corners and 'Sensory on a Shoestring' <u>Sensory Corners</u>

Sensory corners can be big, small and as low priced or expensive as you like. They can be made from a collection of cheap portable equipment or more expensive sensory equipment.

Special schools tend to have more elaborate sensory corners in their classrooms as they are often in use for much of the day.

A mainstream school may have a sensory corner which is a little more conservative and it may be themed, linking into a part of the curriculum.

Sometimes it can be a little blank escape space where a learner can just chill and re charge their batteries

However, the space is often one where the learners have ownership of the corner and they are often used as comforting, calming learning environment where multi-sensory discovery really takes place.
