



## Module 7: Video 9 Transcript, Multisensory Learning Sensory Corners and 'Sensory on a Shoestring' Making Things Safe with a Clear Plastic Box



If you are investing £5 here and £10 there, then the cost of cheap sensory gadgets soon mounts up and there is nothing more frustrating when the £10 light get damaged so why not try this.

Simply take a little storage box and drill some holes in the back. It doesn't have to be neat, random is fine

Then take a cable tie and secure the light into the box.

You could also secure the lid if you want to be extra safe.

So... safe, so simple and securing little sensory objects which can so easily get broken.
